- Why?
- Is there anything you wouldn't suggest? Why?
- This is a simple example....


GenSmarts

- GenSmarts is an “AI” computer application that contains lots of knowledge about records that exist and along with rules as to how they are used in genealogy research.
- By reading the genealogy data you’ve collected in _____ (PAF, Family Tree Maker, RootsMagic, Legacy, TMG, etc.), and apply the rules and knowledge above... research suggestions can be made.
- This is much like what we just did in the previous example, but, being a computer, the speed and complexity of what can be considered exceeds what we can do in our head.

Genealogy Research - Example 2

- Now... imagine if that same friend went to someone else who also didn't know much about genealogy research, but was an internet whiz.
- What guidance do you suppose your friend would get?

Feeling Lucky?



- Keyword search technology is “dumb” compared to the context rich and logical suggestions you gave your friend.
- While keyword searching has its place/role, it’s not a productive, comprehensive technique for genealogy research.

Explanation Illinois 1850 Census for Abel Fike [464]

Why?

Researching the Illinois 1850 Census makes sense because his child, Sarah Fike [345], was married in 1849 in (GSEST. St. Clair County, Illinois) and he died in 1852 in Mascoutah, St Clair, Illinois, USA. The 1850 census is important because it was the first U.S. census to list all family members, not just the head of household.

Hypothesis

GenSmarts has hypothesized a PLACE for you (indicated by the GSEST. prefix) to come up with this suggestion. The basis for this hypothesis was:

GSEST. St. Clair County, Illinois was estimated because his child, Charity Jane Fike [344], was married in 1841 in St. Clair Co., IL.

GenSmarts has 13 ideas.

How does this compare to the ideas we all came up with earlier?

Events in the lives of related people influence the suggestions...

Note there is no marriage suggestion... even though GenSmarts knows about it (a setting allows you to see these if you want).

The list includes diverse things – some free and some pay – government web sites, libraries, etc.

Not every suggestion will pan out, but since the ideas are well reasoned, some of them certainly will.

- Current Version is 2.1.1.83
- Version 1 was released in June of 2003, Version 2 in May of 2007
- www.GenSmarts.com
- Supports research in US, Canada, UK.
- 24.95 to download, 29.95 for a download and CD with 1 hr tutorial, or 34.95 for a Deluxe CD with all of the above plus another 3 hours of tips and techniques. \$5 off currently for a V1 upgrade.
- Win7, Vista, XP, 2000, ME, 98... all version of Windows are fine except Win95. No Mac, though it works fine with Parallels and other newer emulators (but not Virtual PC).
- Works directly with FTM 2010/2009/2008, FTM16 and earlier version, TMG 7,6,5, and 4, RootsMagic 2/3/4, Legacy, PAF, UFT, Personal Historian, Ancestral Quest, and of course Gedcom.
- A free trial version at <http://www.GenSmarts.com> that's somewhat limited and a few versions out of date, but good enough to see how it'll work with your data.
